⁶All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned-every one-to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

The Substituted Servant

⁷ He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter,

The Slaughtered Servant

and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth.

The Silent Servant

- ⁸ By oppression and judgment he was taken away; and as for his generation, who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people?
- ⁹ And they made his grave with the wicked and with a rich man in his death, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

ISAIAH 53:6-10 The Submissive Servant

- Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for guilt, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days;
 - the will of the Lord shall prosper in his hand.

- Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one,
 - by his knowledge shall the righteous one my servant,
 - make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities.

12 Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many,

and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

What does that mean to us? God desires us to live an overcoming life.

Victor Over Sin + Bondages

1PET 3:18

For **Christ** also suffered once **for sins**, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God.

1PET 2:24
