ROMANS 5: 15-21 (ESV)

15 But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if many died through one man's trespass, much more have the grace of God and the free gift by the grace of that one man Jesus Christ abounded for many.

16 And the free gift is not like the result of that one man's sin.

For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought justification.



ROMANS 5: 15-22 (ESV)

17 For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ.

GRACE

GREEK: "CHARIS" to rejoice which signifies "favor," "goodwill," and "lovingkindness" — especially as granted by a superior to an inferior.

LATIN: "GRATIA" which means favor, esteem, regard

GRACE in simple terms is God's unmerited favor and supernatural enablement and empowerment for salvation and for daily sanctification. Grace is everything for nothing to those who don't deserve anything.



Who needs God's Grace?



ROMANS 5: 12-14 (ESV)

12 Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned

13 for sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law.

14 Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sinning was not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one who was to come.



ROMANS 3:23 (ESV)

23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

ROMANS 6:23 (ESV)

23 For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.



Why do we need God's Grace?



POINT 1:

JUSTIFICATION

THE ACTION OF DECLARING OR MAKING RIGHTEOUS IN THE SIGHT OF GOD.



POINT 2:

Because of God's abundant grace we can be triumphant.



ROMANS 5: 15-22 (ESV)
