# Abundantly (perissos) = Greater; Advantage

### John 20:30

Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.



### John 20:30

These are written so that you may GO ON believing that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by going on believing you may go on having life in his name.



### John 10:10-11

### John 9:34

They answered him, "You were born in utter sin, and would you teach us?" And they cast him out.



### John 10:11-13

I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

### John 10:16

And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.
