



1 Peter 3:14-16 (NKJV)

14 But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you are blessed. "And do not be afraid of their threats, nor be troubled."

15 But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear;

16 having a good conscience, that when they defame you as evildoers, those who revile your good conduct in Christ may be ashamed.



2 Timothy 2:23 -25 (NKJV)

23 But avoid foolish and ignorant disputes, knowing that they generate strife.

24 And a servant of the Lord must not quarrel but be gentle to all, able to teach, patient,

25 in humility correcting those who are in opposition, if God perhaps will grant them repentance, so that they may know the truth,

26 and that they may come to their senses and escape the snare of the devil, having been taken captive by him to do his will.

1 Corinthian 13:3 and 13 (NKJV)

² And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing.

13 And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

How do we know the Bible is credible?



2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NKJV)

16 All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

17 that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.

Scripture = Gk. Graphe
Meaning: Written words or documents

Inspiration of God = Gk. Theopneustos
Meaning: Theos (God) and Pneo (to breathe)





The Holy Bible has 66 books.

Old Testament - 39 Books

New Testament - 27 Books



FAQ No.2:

How was it written and who authored it?



2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NKJV)

16 All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

17 that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.



OLD Testament Example Exodus 34:27(NKJV)

Then the LORD said to Moses, "Write these words, for according to the tenor of these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel."



New Testament Example Revelation 1:1-2(NKJV)

¹The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants—things which must shortly take place. And He sent and signified *it* by His angel to His servant John,

² who bore witness to the word of God, and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, to all things that he saw.





There are 40+ authors inspired by God to write the Bible.
Written in different places. (Palace/Island/Prison/and more)
Written in different environments. (War/Peace)
Written in different times of history. (Over 1500+ years)
Written on 3 different continents. (Asia/Africa/Europe)
Written in 3 different languages. (Hebrew/Aramaic/Greek)

Psalm 19:7-9 (NKJV)

7 The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul; The testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple;

8 The statutes of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart;
The commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes;

9 The fear of the Lord is clean, enduring forever; The judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether.

FAQ No.5:

How do you know if you're interpreting the Bible right?



John 14:26 (NKJV)

26 But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you.

Holy Spirit will guide you to interpret the Bible.



2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV)

17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

A changed life is the result of being led by the Holy Spirit. As He teaches you to apply His words in your life.

The Bible has one cohesive theme:

It is the revelation of God of who He is, His everlasting love for us, His redemptive plan through His Son Jesus Christ, and to have an everlasting relationship with His creations.

Rev 1:1-3 (NKJV)

¹ The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants—things which must shortly take place. And He sent and signified *it* by His angel to His servant John,

² who bore witness to the word of God, and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, to all things that he saw.

³ Blessed *is* he who reads and those who hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written in its for the time *is* near.
