

## DEFINING EMPIRICISM

#### Oxford Dictionary of Philosophy (2008)

The view that all knowledge of facts must be derived from experience. Empiricists maintain that sense experience is the ultimate source of all our concepts and knowledge, in contrast to rationalists who hold that knowledge can also be gained independently of experience, through reason.

### 3 Problems

Logical and Mathematical laws are not empirically derived.

Objective moral laws are not empirically derived.

Empiricism itself cannot be empirically verified.

## EMPIRICAL EVIDENCE

#### **Tacitus (AD 56-120)**

Christus, from whom the name had its origin, suffered the extreme penalty during the reign of Tiberius at the hands of one of our procurators, Pontius Pilatus... (Annals 15.44)

#### Mara Bar-Serapion (c. AD 80)

What advantage did the Jews gain from executing their wise King? It was just after that their kingdom was abolished... (Letter to his son)

Babylonian Talmud: On the eve of Passover Yeshu was hanged. For forty days before the execution took place, a herald went forth and cried, 'He is going forth to be stoned because he has practiced sorcery and enticed Israel to apostasy. Anyone who can say anything in his favor, let him come forward and plead on his behalf.' But since nothing was brought forward in his favor he was hanged on the eve of the Passover. (Sanhedrin 43a)

- Jesus died by crucifixion
- He was in Joseph's tomb
- The tomb was empty on the 3rd day
- The disciples came to believe in the Resurrection

# THE EMPIRICAL JUSTIFICATION OF THE GOSPEL

1. The Prophets (Scripture) predicts the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus.



2. The Apostles present eyewitness accounts of the ministry of Jesus in conformity with Scripture.



3. The Prophetic Prediction and Apostolic Account are supported by historical/empirical data.
